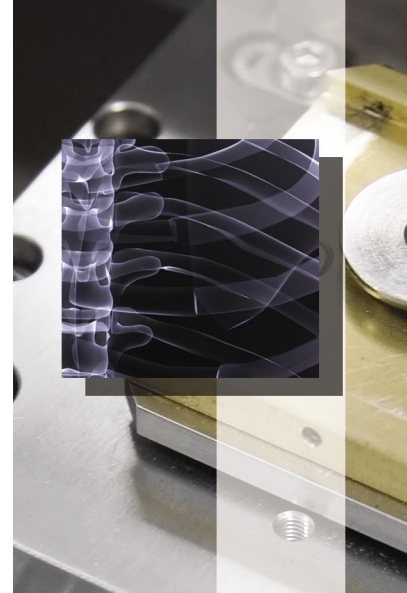


The Harrison County Advantage: Our People.

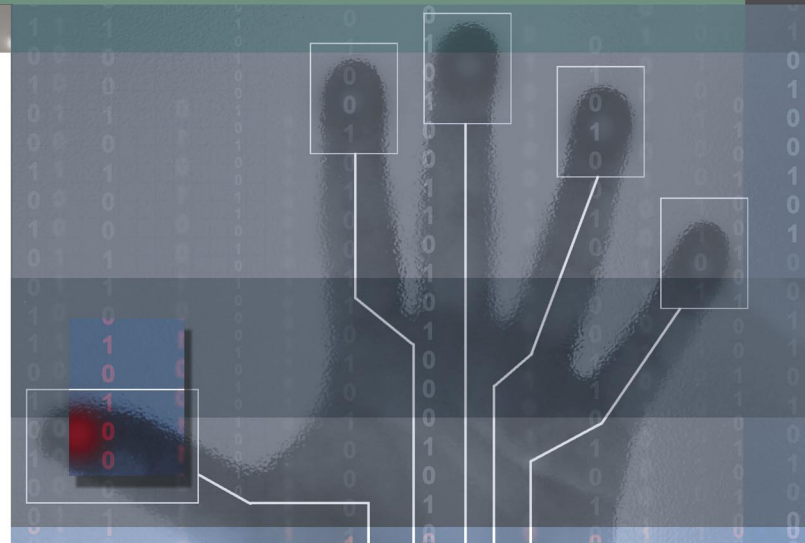
